




FRIDAY, APRIL 25TH - Evening departure from your chosen US gateway to London.
OVERNIGHT: PLANE

SATURDAY, APRIL 26TH - Your arrival at London's Heathrow Airport will be met for the short journey (1 hour) to Winchester. After time for lunch and checking in to our hotel, there will be a walking tour of the centre of this beautiful medieval city, past the house where she spent her final days and including a visit to Winchester Cathedral. The Cathedral has the longest nave of any Gothic cathedral in Europe and houses Jane Austen's tomb. This evening a dinner party welcomes you to England. **(D) OVERNIGHT: WINCHESTER**

SUNDAY, APRIL 27TH - Our excursion today takes us first to nearby Steventon, where Jane's father, George Austen, was the rector. Jane was baptized here and spent her first 25 years living in the rectory. The church remains little changed from her day, but unfortunately the rectory is no longer standing. From here we continue to Chawton and have lunch in a country pub. After lunch we'll visit the Jane Austen House Museum, and (if available) have a private visit to the library at Chawton House (Jane's brother, Edward Austen Knight's residence). We return to Winchester for a free evening. **(B, L) OVERNIGHT: WINCHESTER**

MONDAY, APRIL 28TH - Our first stop this morning will be nearby Salisbury. We'll visit the cathedral and Mompesson House, located in the Cathedral Close. Mompesson House will be instantly recognizable from the recent film version of Sense and Sensibility. After free time for lunch, a short drive brings us to the World Heritage Site of Stonehenge. We continue through the beautiful Wiltshire countryside to the Georgian city of Bath. There will be time to unpack and freshen up before dinner at our hotel in the city center. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: BATH**



WINCHESTER CATHEDRAL

TUESDAY, APRIL 29TH - A full day in Bath, Miss Austen's home from 1801-1806, and familiarly described in Persuasion and Northanger Abbey. Sightseeing will include Jane Austen's House, the Jane Austen Museum and a guided tour of the Assembly Rooms (subject to their opening schedule). The afternoon will be free to explore this beautiful city and the evening free to sample a local restaurant. **(B) OVERNIGHT: BATH**




CITYSCAPE OF BATH

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 30TH - This morning we take an excursion from Bath to Stourhead and Wells. Known as the Flagship of the National Trust, the gardens of Stourhead are justly famous as one of the finest examples of 18th-century landscaping in the country. We'll tour the gardens and stop for lunch in the village pub. This afternoon we visit Wells, the smallest city in England, with its magnificent cathedral. We'll return to Bath for a free evening. **(B) OVERNIGHT: BATH**

THURSDAY, MAY 1ST - This morning a walking tour introduces the history of the city of Bath. Our first stop will be Bath Abbey, the last of the great English pre-Reformation churches, built in a pleasantly consistent late-perpendicular style. From the Abbey we walk across the piazza to the Roman Baths. These are some of the most extensive and best-preserved Roman remains in the country and the whole underground complex makes a fascinating visit. Our tour ends at the Pump Room where you can stay and have lunch. The afternoon and evening are free to explore the many attractions that Bath has to offer. **(B) OVERNIGHT: BATH**

FRIDAY, MAY 2ND - This morning a quick drive along the motorway, heading east, brings us to Royal Windsor for our final night. After checking in to our hotel, we will visit Windsor Castle and have time to explore the town before we gather this evening for a farewell dinner at the hotel. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: WINDSOR**

SATURDAY, MAY 3RD - Depending on the numbers of people taking this extension, we will either take the fast train from Reading direct to Manchester, or drive north, stopping in Shakespeare's town of Stratford-upon-Avon en route. We end our day in the delightful village of Alderley Edge, where we'll enjoy dinner at our hotel. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: ALDERLEY EDGE**

SUNDAY, MAY 4TH - A day following in the footsteps of Elizabeth Gaskell. We begin by driving the short distance into the town of Knutsford, Elizabeth's Cranford. We'll take a walking tour of the town center, showing us her childhood home, the church where she married William Gaskell and her final resting place. We will also see the Gaskell memorial Tower built in the center of town in 1907 by Richard Harding Watt. There will be free time to find lunch, before we meet up again for a visit to Tatton Park. This stately home was the inspiration for Cumnor Towers, home of the Cumnor family in *Wives & Daughters*. We'll tour the house and gardens and then return to Alderley Edge, where the evening is free to sample a local restaurant or pub in the village. **(B) OVERNIGHT: ALDERLEY EDGE**

MONDAY, MAY 5TH - We'll begin our day by visiting Elizabeth Gaskell's home at 84 Plymouth Grove in the (what was then) affluent Manchester suburb of Victoria Park, where she lived from 1850 to 1865. We'll have a private tour of the house and a talk on the life and importance of "one of the greatest female novelists of all time," as she was described in the press after her death. This evening we enjoy a farewell dinner at our hotel. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: ALDERLEY EDGE**

SUNDAY, MAY 6TH - Morning transfers to nearby Manchester Airport for returning flights to the U.S. **(B) OVERNIGHT: HOME**
