


**THURSDAY, MAY 8** - This morning, you'll experience the art of Irish cuisine firsthand at Ballyknocken Cookery School, House, and Farm, where expert chefs guide you through immersive cooking classes amidst the picturesque beauty of County Wicklow's countryside. Following our cooking class, we will enjoy a light lunch before making our way to Mount Usher Gardens. Exquisite in every dimension, Mount Usher exemplifies the authentic 'Robinsonian' style garden, harmonizing a distinguished array of trees and shrubs with informal floral planting schemes in a picturesque valley setting. The garden boasts an ever-evolving spectrum of colors and textures, complemented by enchanting scents that evolve with each changing season. **FRIDAY, MAY 9** - Leaving Wicklow, our first stop today will be in Waterford, for a tour of the Waterford Crystal Factory, followed by lunch. Our next stop will be Lismore Castle Gardens, believed to be the oldest gardens in Ireland. Nestled amid lush greenery and overlooking the serene River Blackwater, Lismore Castle is an architectural gem steeped in rich history and cultural significance. Dating back to the 12th century, this magnificent fortress boasts beautifully landscaped gardens, captivating art collections, and a storied past that intertwines with the heritage of Ireland. From here, we make our way to our hotel in Killarney, where dinner awaits us. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: KILLARNEY** 



**SATURDAY, MAY 10** - Today, a panorama of some of Ireland's most famous scenery as we tour the Ring of Kerry. We'll meander leisurely around the Ring—112 miles of the most beautiful coastal scenery in the world - stopping for photographs and chances to stretch our legs and admire the views. On our return to Killarney, we'll

visit Muckross House, an imposing Victorian mansion with elegant rooms full of period furnishings including a museum of Kerry Life. The setting is spectacular, on the edge of the largest of the Killarney Lakes and nestling in the shadows of the Macgillycuddy's Reeks—the local mountain range. For those who want to stretch their legs, it's a beautiful walk around the lake back to our hotel. This evening is free to sample some local cuisine. **(B) OVERNIGHT: KILLARNEY** 



**SUNDAY, MAY 11** - After a leisurely start to the day, we leave Killarney, heading north to Galway. We'll make a stop in Limerick for lunch before continuing to the coast to see the Cliffs of Moher and (time permitting) take a walk along the coastal path. Continuing north, we'll stop and visit the Poulnabrone Dolmen before continuing to the Burren. This is one of the most remarkable geological formations in Ireland—a wild, limestone plateau filled with rare flora and dotted with prehistoric monuments. From here, we continue our journey to our hotel, where dinner is included this evening. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: GALWAY** 

**MONDAY, MAY 12 -** Today, we will take an excursion to Inishmore, the largest of the Aran Islands, set in Galway Bay. On arrival, we'll enjoy a tour on an island mini-bus, or simply pick up a bicycle at the town pier and explore the island independently (no private cars are allowed on the island). We visit the mystical Dun Aengus, a 2000-year-old fort with an imposing position overlooking the Atlantic, and The Aran Island Heritage Centre. The Islands are still largely Gaelic-speaking and maintain many of the traditional Irish Island customs, which reflect the harshness of island life. We return to the mainland in the late afternoon and return to Galway for a free evening where you may choose to take in a performance at Trad on the Prom, a contemporary Irish show featuring an electrifying mix of traditional Irish music, song and dance. **(B) OVERNIGHT: GALWAY** 

**TUESDAY, MAY 13 -** Leaving Galway, we return to Dublin, stopping along the way in Birr to visit the Castle and Gardens. One of Ireland's most intriguing destinations, steeped in scientific achievements and home to the remarkable Parsons family for 400 years, this rare opportunity allows visitors to explore the castle's magnificent interiors. Delve into the exquisite craftsmanship of its five main reception rooms and uncover the rich history within. We'll have time for lunch before making our way to the hotel. We'll arrive in time for a festive farewell Irish dinner and entertainment at the famous Merry Ploughboy's Restaurant. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: DUBLIN**
