

AN EXTRAORDINARY LAND APART NOVEMBER 3RD - 11TH 2017

In many ways, Sicily is a world apart. Life is lived more intensely against a backdrop of feasts, feuds, and passions; colors are more intense, too—a brilliant blue sea, sharp contrasts of light and dark under an almost tropical sun, explosively tinted pottery in vivid reds, yellows, and greens; and food is tinged with sweet and sour blends from the Eastern Europe and Northern Africa.



THE FOUNTAIN OF SHAME, PALERMO

We'll enter into the life of this gorgeous and mysterious island in the capital, Palermo and then stay in Agrigento and Taormina, a lovely seaside town on the east coast of Sicily. From here, we'll explore the surrounding countryside and visit a stunning collection of medieval towns that each vies for the title of "Most Beautiful." Here, architecture recalls a multitude of times and places: Agrigento, with its dramatic ancient ruins, the world-famous 4th-century mosaics at Piazza Armerina, and the magnificent site at Syracuse—all dominated by majestic Mount Etna, looming over the island landscape.

With a balance of guided excursions and leisure time to explore at your own pace, you'll have an opportunity to experience Sicily's winding medieval streets, glittering beaches, and the rare and unique ecosystem at Mount Etna. Take in the view from the outstanding Greek amphitheatre in Taormina—with the mountain, sea, and sky above, it is one of the most beautiful vistas to be seen on an island of incomparable beauty.

Although in full view of mainland Italy, even Sicilians talk of "going to Italy," and consider their island an extraordinary land apart.

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 3rd - Evening departure from your US departure city. **OVERNIGHT: PLANE**

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 4th - On arrival at Palermo, you will be met for the transfer to our hotel. There will be time to unpack and relax before your tour guide gives you an orientation to the neighborhood. This evening, enjoy a welcome dinner party at the hotel. **(D)**

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 5th - A morning panoramic tour with a local guide introduces Palermo, a vibrant city whose glorious past is visible everywhere in its rich collection of monuments, including the 12th-century Arab-Norman Capella Palatina and the 18th-century gardens of Parco della Favorita e Giardini della Palazzina Cinese. This afternoon we'll take an excursion west of the city to visit Monreale's outstanding 12th-century cathedral, with 6,000 square yards of 12th- and 13th-century mosaics depicting the complete cycle of Old and New Testaments, and the Benedictine Cloisters. The evening is free in Palermo to sample Sicilian cuisine at a local restaurant. **(B)** **OVERNIGHT: PALERMO**

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 6th - Leaving Palermo, we head to Segesta to view one of the most impressive Greek temples in the world, overlooking a valley of wild fennel. We'll stop to visit the remains of a Greek theater with views of the sea, then continue to the medieval town of Erice with its narrow, cobblestone streets. After free time for lunch we'll continue around the coast to Selinunte, where an array of Greek temple ruins overlooks the Mediterranean. We'll check in to our hotel with time to relax before dinner. **(B, D)**

OVERNIGHT: AGRIGENTO

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 7th - Surrounded by olive trees, Agrigento's Valley of the Temples was described by the poet Pindar as "the most beautiful city built by mortal men." The temples comprise one of the most impressive classical sites in Italy. After a morning tour of the site and the Archaeological Museum with a local guide, there is time for lunch at a beachfront restaurant. In the afternoon, relax, enjoy the pool area, or explore the town of Agrigento. The evening is free - why not try a restaurant overlooking the Valley of the Temples, which are illuminated at night. **(B)**

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 8th - Our morning visit to the charming Baroque town of Caltagirone, famous for its ceramics, allows time for shopping and a relaxing cappuccino. From here, we travel to Villa Romana del Casale in Piazza Armerina for a visit. This exceptionally well-preserved example of a luxurious Roman 4th-century villa contains some of the finest mosaics of the Roman world. We continue on to Taormina, with time to check in and freshen up before we gather for dinner at our hotel.

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 9th - Taormina, proclaimed "the greatest work of art and nature" by Goethe, affords a spectacular view of the sea below and Mount Etna. After breakfast, we depart on a half-day excursion to the mountain, one of the world's major active volcanoes and the largest and highest in Europe. We return to Taormina for a free afternoon - perhaps after lunch you'd like to explore the town's famous Greek theater.

The evening is free. **(B)**

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 10th

- Today we travel south along the Ionian Sea to Siracusa, once rivaling Athens in splendor and power, with its ruins of a fine Roman Amphitheater. At Siracusa's southern end, on the medieval island of Ortygia, we'll visit Piazza Archimedes' spectacular fountains and Piazza del

Duomo, one of Italy's most beautiful piazzas. You're free to lunch at a lovely harborside restaurant before we return to Taormina. There will be time to relax before gathering for dinner at the hotel. **(B, D)**

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 11th - Morning transfers to Catania Airport for returning flights to the USA - or stay on to visit Malta.

OPTIONAL MALTA EXTENSION:

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 11th - We board a flight this morning from Catania direct to Valletta in Malta. Our arrival will be met for the transfer to our fabulous hotel in the city center, the Phoenicia Malta. After time to unpack and relax, we will gather for a walking tour of Valletta with a local guide, we'll wander along Republic Street, past the Auberge de Castille and then onto the Upper Barrakka Gardens where you can marvel at the view. We'll include visits to the Grand Master's palace, the National Museum of Archeology and St. John's Co-Cathedral. The rest of the afternoon is free to explore the city or relax at the hotel. Dinner is included at the hotel this evening. **(B, D)**

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 12th - A full day excursion today begins with a visit to the Three Cities. Cospicua, Vittoriosa and Senglea are three fortified towns that collectively claim to be the cradle of Maltese history. Our next stop is the charming, traditional fishing village of Marsaxlokk and on our way back to our hotel we'll visit the Neolithic Temple of Hagar Qim, believed to have been a fertility shrine, and well known for the 'Venus of Malta' statue. We return to our hotel in Valletta for a free evening. **(B)**

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 13th - Today brings an excursion to the neighboring island of Gozo, a short 20 minute ferry ride away. We'll visit the Xaghra plateau and the temples of Ggantija, at 5,500 years old they were, until recently, claimed to be the oldest free-standing stone structures in the world. We continue on to the Citadel, a fortified city that was the administrative capital of the independent Roman province of Gozo. Our farewell dinner will be at a local restaurant this evening when we return to Valletta. **(B, D)**
