Connoisseurs of fine furniture, porcelain, and china will find priceless examples of Chippendale, Wedgwood, and Meissen.



After arriving at London's Heathrow Airport, you'll be transferred to Salisbury, our base of explorations for the coming week. From this city and its glorious cathedral, we'll take day trips to a variety of spectacular locations that either contain magnificent art collections or have inspired artists throughout the centuries. From Highclere Castle (of Downton Abbey fame) to Wilton House, from Stourhead Gardens to Stonehenge and Jane Austen's house at Chawton to Sally Lunn's Tea Room in Bath, we have assembled a wide variety of visits all within a short coach ride from our base.

Together our small group (maximum 15 participants) will explore the hills and dales, villages, and towns at a relaxed pace

that will allow you to appreciate the full glory of some of Britain's Stately Homes, set against the backdrop of a glorious full-blown English spring.

SATURDAY, MAY 6<sup>TH</sup> - Departure from your chosen US gateway. OVERNIGHT: PLANE

SUNDAY, MAY 7<sup>TH</sup> - Your morning arrival at Heathrow Airport will be met for the transfer to our hotel in Salisbury (1hr. 30 min. drive). After checking in, there will be time to unpack and relax before your tour guide leads a walking tour to introduce you to Salisbury. We will return to our hotel in time for cocktails before dinner. (D) OVERNIGHT: SALISBURY

**MONDAY, MAY 8<sup>TH</sup>** - This morning, we visit magnificent Highclere Castle, better known as *Downton Abbey*, from the television series of the same name. We will have a tour of the house and time to explore the gardens. A short drive from Highclere brings us to the ancient

market town of Marlborough, nestled in the Marlborough Downs, where we will have time for lunch before continuing on to Avebury. The neolithic stone circle at Avebury, is so large that the whole village fits inside it! After time to explore the stones we will pay a visit to the 16th-century Avebury Manor. There will be free time to shop and explore before we return to Salisbury for dinner.

Tuesday, May 9<sup>TH</sup> - After breakfast this morning, we drive the short distance to the majestic and mysterious World Heritage site of Stonehenge on Salisbury Plain. We'll spend some time admiring the monument, and the exhibition in its modern visitor facilities before continuing to nearby Wilton House, an English stately home that has been the country seat of the Earls of Pembroke for over 400 years. We'll tour the house and have time to wander the gardens and to find lunch before we return to Salisbury. On arrival, we'll take a tour of Salisbury Cathedral and then have free time to explore the city. You may like to stay at the cathedral for a choral evensong or explore the nearby Mompesson House, where *Sense and Sensibility* was filmed. (B) OVERNIGHT: SALISBURY



WEDNESDAY, MAY 10<sup>TH</sup> - Our excursion today takes us first to Jane Austen's

home, an attractive 17th-century house in the pretty village of Chawton, where Austen wrote and revised her novels, including *Pride and Prejudice*. The museum houses an interesting collection of furniture, jewelry, and needlework, and the lovely garden contains various plants and herbs common to the late 18th century. After touring the grounds we continue to Winchester, once the Saxon capital of the kingdom of Wessex. After time for lunch here, we'll visit Winchester Cathedral, where Jane Austen is buried, and take a short walking

tour of the charming medieval town center. Tonight we will gather for dinner as a group at a restaurant in Salisbury. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: SALISBURY



Thursday, May 11<sup>TH</sup> - Our first stop this morning is to the charming town of Shaftesbury. Thursday is market day in Shaftesbury, so we will have time to explore the market before visiting the Gold Hill Museum & Garden. After time to enjoy this charming, small museum and its award-winning cottage garden, we'll take in the view over Blackmore Vale, described as "one of the most romantic sights in England." There will be time for lunch in the town before we visit nearby Stourhead Gardens, one of the most beautiful English landscaped garden in the country. We return to our hotel for a free evening. (B) OVERNIGHT: SALISBURY

FRIDAY, MAY 12<sup>TH</sup> - We travel northwest this morning, to the city of Bath, where we'll visit the Roman Baths, perhaps the best-preserved Roman remains in Britain, and the Jane Austen Center. After lunch at historic Sally Lunn's, Bath's oldest house (c.1482) we continue this afternoon to the town of Lacock. Lacock has been featured in many British movies, including *Downton Abbey*, *Pride and Prejudice*, and *Cranford*. Upon arrival, we will visit the Abbey as a group before free time to explore on your own. The evening is free in Salisbury, to sample a local restaurant. (B, L) OVERNIGHT: SALISBURY

SATURDAY, MAY 13<sup>TH</sup> - After breakfast, a short drive will bring us to Montacute House. We'll have time to explore the formal gardens, visit the Orangery, and wander down the Lime Avenue before we turn our attention to the inside of the house. This beautiful Elizabethan country home was featured recently in the BBC production of *Wolf Hall* and also houses a part of the collection of the National Portrait Gallery. After time to visit the Courtyard Café for a bite to eat, we'll head to nearby Tintinhull Gardens. This Arts and Crafts style garden is divided into 7 rooms by clipped yew hedges and walls. Each garden room has its own character but joins together in complete harmony. We return to Salisbury for our final evening dinner together as a group. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: SALISBURY

SUNDAY, MAY 14<sup>TH</sup> - Morning transfers to Heathrow Airport for return flights to the US. (B) OVERNIGHT: HOME
