## ALL of the CREATURES: GREAT & SMAL 2nd Cup & of Tea Travel

## AUGUST 2<sup>ND</sup> - 13<sup>TH</sup> 2023

The recently released second season of the wonderful TV series, All Creatures Great and Small, was a co-production between Channel 5 in the UK and America's PBS and has been a huge success on both sides of the Atlantic. James Alfred Wight, writing under the pen name of James Herriott, actually only wrote 2 novels (If Only They Could Talk, published in 1970, and It Shouldn't Happen to a Vet, in 1972) based on his experiences as a vet in the Yorkshire Dales in the 1930s. The format of the novels, with each chapter, almost being a separate story, lent itself perfectly to the structure of a television series. The title, of course, comes from the hymn by Mrs. Cecil Alexander, which begins "All things bright and beautiful, ...." Here is your opportunity to visit some of the locations at which the series was filmed.

But there is so much more . . . We begin our adventure in Edinburgh in time to attend the opening of the Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo, which, in turn, heralds the beginning of the annual Edinburgh Festival of Arts.

Heading south we cross the current border with England and then continue to the ancient Roman border - Hadrian's Wall. This remarkable engineering feat was built on Emperor Hadrian's orders following his visit to Britain in 122 CE. It marked the northern frontier of the Roman Empire for the next 300 years.

Further south, we stop at the city of Durham, the ancient seat of the Prince Bishops and home to the remains of St Cuthbert of Lindisfarne. When the Holy Island of Lindisfarne became unsafe due to frequent Viking raids, they carried the body of the saint to the site of the current Norman Cathedral. Amazingly when the coffin was opened upon his elevation to sainthood, expecting to find his bones inside, the body was found to be completely intact. True proof of sainthood.




SATURDAY, AUGUST 5<sup>TH</sup> - South across the border, we drive through Northumberland - wild and untamed nature, to reach the very limits of the Roman Empire - the amazing Hadrian's

Wall at Housesteads Roman Fort and learn why the Romans said 'this far, but no further'. After a quick pub lunch we head to onto Beamish Open Air Museum,

this is a truly splendid museum and like stepping back in time (my uncle is a consultant for them for everything that concerns old farming machinery and techniques). Then we drive to Durham - where I went to University. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: DURHAM** 

**SUNDAY, AUGUST 6<sup>TH</sup>** - Durham is the most beautiful city in the North of England, bar none. My favourite cathedral of the whole courtly is here too. We can also visit the Castle - my college. There are some lovely shops to take in over a free afternoon. **(B) OVERNIGHT: DURHAM** 

**MONDAY, AUGUST** 7<sup>TH</sup> - Now we truly head into All Creatures Country... After morning tea and elevenses in the wonderful market town of Barnard Castle we head across the moors and onto my uncle's farm - one of the highest in England and home to the largest herd of Belted Galloways in the country. After a tour of the farm - a true James Herriot traditional stone farm, we head past the past the famous Red Lion Pub (featured in the series) and onto Reeth in Upper Swaledale. **(B, T, L, D) OVERNIGHT: REETH** 



**TUESDAY, AUGUST 8<sup>TH</sup>** - Beatrix Potter Day - we set off to the Lakes - across Windermere, on which we can sail. We also take in the cottage near Ambleside. The drives today are truly beautiful, the best of the English countryside. On the way home we call in at Tan Hill, England's famous, highest pub for a traditional dinner. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: REETH** 



WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 9<sup>TH</sup> - Off over the moors - so photogenic - past country homes and traditional stone farm cottages to Masham where we visit the famous Black Sheep brewery and learn its history, as well as sample the goods. Today we will also watch another iconic Yorkshire event: sheep dog trials these must be seen to be believed. We continue to Askrigg and checking into The Skeldale House - now a wonderful B&B. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: ASKRIGG

**THURSDAY, AUGUST 10^{TH}** - Continuing our All Creatures adventure, we head to Thirsk, where they were vets - and to the wonderful World of James Herriot Museum, a great place to visit. After lunch, we board the Wensleydale steam train at Finghall station, famous from the series, before driving home to Askrigg. **(B, L) OVERNIGHT: ASKRIGG** 

**FRIDAY, AUGUST 11<sup>TH</sup>** - We head to beautiful Grassington in The Dales, where the new series is filmed. This is a quintessential Yorkshire village in beautiful scenery, a lovely place from which to say goodbye to James Herriot country and head for the cities. After lunch we drive south to York it self, the splendid medieval market town famed for its Tudor streets, fabulous tea and wonderful Minster. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: YORK** 

**SATURDAY, AUGUST 12<sup>TH</sup>** - This morning we will board our train to London where you will have the afternoon to explore and enjoy lunch on your own before gathering together for a farewell dinner. (B, D) **OVERNIGHT: LONDON**
