



Warnings of new travel regulations have been floating around for some time, and it is finally happening. As of January 1st, 2024, all North American visitors to Europe will be required to complete an online visa waiver application before boarding a plane. The system, known as ETIAS, is more commonly called an "electronic travel authorization." While this process is new to us,

Europeans visiting the United States have been required to go through an identical process since 1986. It is an additional step we have to do before travelling abroad, and, of course, there are costs associated with it—currently, it has been set a \$7 per person, but that is subject to change. The online application process is relatively straightforward and (they say) will only take a few minutes to complete. You will then receive your authorization within 96 hours—unless further documentation is required. Once approved your ETIAS will last for 3 years before

having to be renewed. Discover Europe staff will always be available to assist you with the process. Full details about these new regulations can be found at www.etiaseu.com.
