Early Bird Discount - We understand that the current global situation encourages people to wait until the last minute to sign up for trips. Not only does that risk your chosen tour being unavailable, but it also makes life more complicated for us in terms of forward

planning. So we are happy to announce a new early bird incentive. If you sign up for any tours departing after September 1st 2021 before March 1st, 2021 you will receive a discount of \$200 per person off your final balance (not valid with any other offers).

WHAT'S IN A WORD?

The word "curfew" has been used a lot recently for many reasons in many different countries. Listening to it made me think - that's a strange word, I wonder where it comes from? One of the advantages of being in lockdown is that it gives you time to pursue these flights of fancy!

In fact the answer became obvious, in a way, while I was in France a few weeks ago and they announced the hours for the new "couvre-feu" - or curfew, in English. However, rather than satisfy my curiosity, this merely sparked my interest in how, what was evidently a corruption of a French term (the English are famous for that!), became the word meaning that you were not allowed out on the streets.

It turns out that the original "curfew" had a different intention. The primary fear in medieval cities, where the houses were all built of wood very close together, was not protesters taking to the streets of an evening, but fire that could quickly and easily spread from one building to those adjacent (Great Fire of London of 1666, for example). So at a certain designated time of the evening the populace was commanded to put out or cover their fires, in French, the couvre-feu.

Rich with ancient history, the Pyrenean mountain range, which forms a natural border between France and Spain, is a cultural melting pot - from Catalonia in the east to the Basque region at the western end of the mountain chain. This combination of tours will explore the varied culture and incredible scenery of the Pyrenees and then travel into Northern Spain following the Camino de Santiago - the Pilgrims' Way - from Bilbao to Santiago de Compostela.

There is also the option of extending the tour with a few days in Camon at the start to join the festivities of the annual Camon Rose Festival. Camon is known as "The Village of Roses."

THE WILD ISLANDS OF SCOTLAND

Scattered off the coast of Scotland are over 790 islands, only 94 of which are inhabited. Each island has a unique, rugged beauty and what inhabitants there are, are fiercely independent. From the ancient neolithic history found in the Orkney Islands to the Viking heritage of the Hebrides in the west - they are truly worth a visit.


HERE ARE A FEW OF OUR FAVORITES:

ISLE OF ISLAY - The Isle of Islay, pronounced "eye-luh," is called the Queen of the Hebrides. It's famous for beautiful sandy beaches, diverse birdlife and distinc-


tive malt whiskies (it currently has 8 world-renowned distilleries). It is home to both monuments of the past as well as a thriving modern society. While you're here, make sure to visit the Kildalton Cross, an intricately carved Celtic cross which dates back to the 8th century. It is thought to be the oldest Celtic cross surviving in Scotland. Our tour *Lords of the Sea Kingdom* (July 22 - 31, 2022) visits Islay.

THE ISLE OF SKYE - One of our favorite places in Scotland, this dramatic island is the epitome of the highlands. It's characterized by mountainous landscapes, beautiful coastlines and scenic waterfall pools called "Fairy Pools." Our tours *Skye & the Highlands* (June 24 - July 4, 2021) and *Castles of the Highlands* (May 26 - June 4, 2022) both visit Skye.

ORKNEY & SHETLAND ISLANDS - Off the northern tip of Scotland, you can travel back in time 6,000 years with a visit to the Orkneys and the Shetlands. Rich in ancient history, they are full of magical, evocative Neolithic sites, such as the Standing Stones of Stenness, Skara Brae, Northern Europe's best-preserved neolithic village, and the Ring of Brodgar, which is estimated to have taken 80,000 man-hours to construct.
